NYAHSА President Carl Young presents annual report for 2008

I am pleased to present the NYAHSА-PAC's 2008 annual report. Although the state faced an economically tumultuous year, the NYAHSА-PAC was able to raise more than \$75,000. The success of the PAC is particularly meaningful since NYAHSА-PAC's funding comes from individual, personal contributions, unlike other advocacy groups in Albany, that have the ability to rely on big corporate contributors or the collection of payroll deductions from employee paychecks. NYAHSА member organizations are prohibited from making political contributions due to their not-for-profit status.



The NYAHSА-PAC thrives only by making political action a broad-based effort. Increased participation from individuals associated with NYAHSА will greatly impact our success in Albany and combining our resources allows us to advocate more effectively for long term care issues.

It is a critical time for the NYAHSА-PAC. The 2008 state government elections gave the Senate Democrats a slim two-seat majority over the Republicans. As a result, many of the budget negotiations were held in private, making it even more difficult to advocate for long term care services. Due to the diligence of NYAHSА staff and the help from PAC contributors, we were able to scale back many of the proposed budget cuts facing seniors. Lawmakers have expressed that they will likely return to Albany in special session to make further spending cuts which could impact long term care. Strong support for the NYAHSА-PAC is essential in getting out our message on long term care financing and restructuring. Together, we must build upon last year's success and continue to make 2009 a banner year.

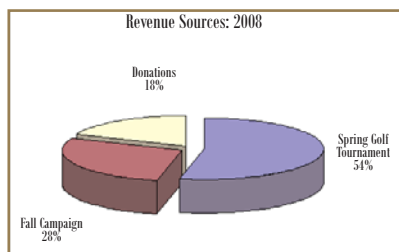

Financial Review 2008

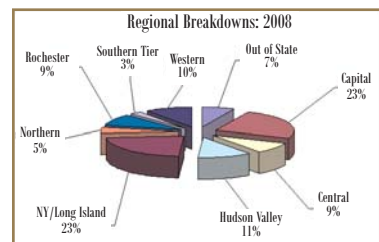
Thanks to the generous support of individuals, vendors and NYAHSAs members and staff, the NYAHSAs-PAC raised \$75,911 in 2008. Although contributions were less than in 2007, this is nearly consistent with prior year contributions.

As in past years, the PAC held two major fundraising efforts in 2008, raising over \$41,000 for the Spring Golf Invitational and more than \$23,000 from the NYAHSAs-PAC Fall Campaign.

PAC revenue is divided into three categories: donations, fall campaign and spring golf tournament. The donation category reflects contributions received by the PAC that were not solicited through the fall campaign or the golf tournament. As seen below, more than half of the PAC revenue stream comes from the Spring Golf Invitational. Donations and the fall campaign represent 18 percent and 28 percent, respectively.



The New York City/Long Island region makes up the largest portion of the NYAHSAs membership and in past years, our largest share came from this region. This year, both the Capital and the NYC/Long Island regions reflected about 23 percent of the fall campaign donations. Although we had fewer facilities participating in 2008, we raised about the same as previous years. Nevertheless, in 2008, the PAC saw increases in contribution levels from the Northern, Rochester and Western New York regions. We saw a 4



percent increase in the Northern, a 1 percent increase in Rochester and a 1 percent increase in Western New York. The chart at left lists the percentage that each

region has contributed towards the PAC's annual total.

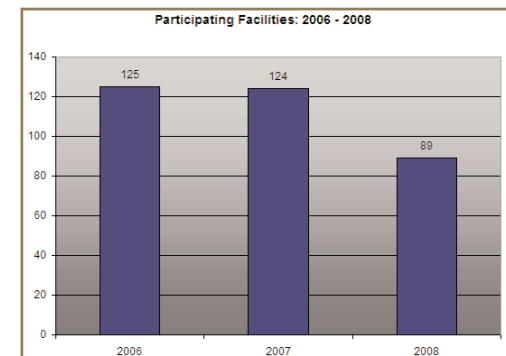
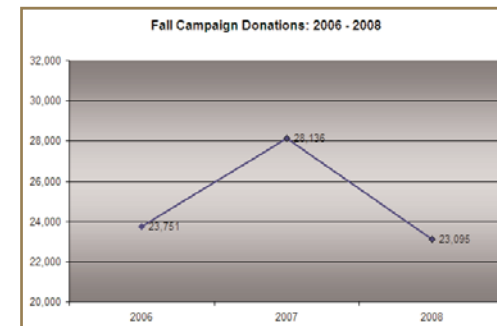

Final analysis of the 2008 Fall Campaign

The fall campaign ran from October 1 through December 31. In 2008, the PAC continued to strive to increase awareness and participation among the membership and therefore asked every organization to contribute a minimum of \$250. Although it was an economically devastating year for many, the hard work of PAC members drew in \$23,095.



Throughout the fall campaign, administrators received e-mails updating them on the campaign's progress. The campaign also produced over 2,000 letters and brochures that were mailed to nursing homes, community-based services, adult care facilities and housing administrators, as well as NYAHSAs board/committee members and vendors. Information about the PAC and the fall campaign was also featured at NYAHSAs's regional meetings throughout the fall.

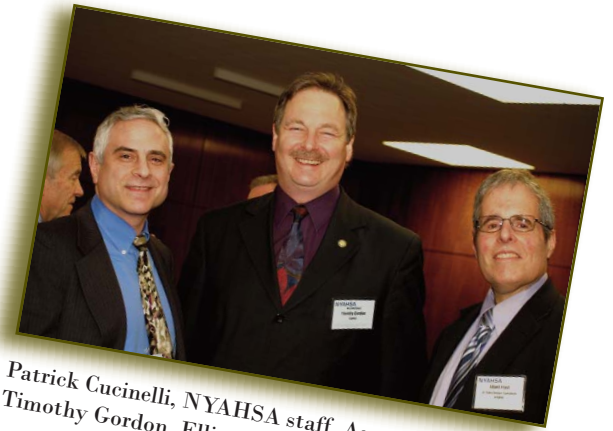
